Several years ago I found myself as a new pastor in a situation in which I was just learning how to be comfortable. I had been called to the hospital Pastor's Message to visit Rose who had just had a massive stroke. I was filled with all sorts

of anxieties about saying the right thing and being a comfort and support to a family that would soon be saying goodbye to this lovely woman. As I entered her room her doctor was just getting ready to leave and she informed me that she didn't have long and that she would not be able to hear me or to speak. The stroke had taken her ability to form words and it had completely paralyzed half of her body while slowly shutting down her internal organs.

Her best friend Gladys was with her, by her side, as she had been since they were in grade school together. I listened to this no nonsense woman process her grief and let the doctor's news sink in. And then I asked her if we could pray with Rose. And so we joined hands we each other and this lovely woman and we prayed together. We finished our time of prayer by praying the Lord's prayer and wouldn't you know it, Rose decided to chime in. Her eyes were closed and half of her face was paralyzed but she was praying the prayer. It wasn't just in whispers, it wasn't a trick of the ears, we weren't mistaken, she was praying out loud with us.

Now, if you speak with other pastors you would surely hear stories that echo this one. When you have been marked with the sign of the cross and you have these words of love and belonging etched into your being, they tend to hold us up and draw us out when we find ourselves in these thin places. These thin places are locales and times where the distance between heaven and earth

collapse and we're able to catch glimpses of the divine. They are like manna for the journey.

When we told the doctor what had happened she simply dismissed it and said that it was impossible. But Gladys and I know exactly what we experienced. And we held onto that moment less than a week later when we buried her. The final word from her mouth was a resounding, "Amen," as though her life had been a prayer that now rested in God.

My fervent hope is that we all have the opportunity to experience this kind of faith, faith that is so much a part of our very being that when everything else is taken away from us, who we are in Christ remains. This season of Lent is an invitation to remember your baptism. Remember who you are in Christ. Remember that while the world may seem to be spinning out of control and we feel as though we are being caught up in it, Christ is our anchor. The storm will pass, the waves will calm. We don't allow the storm to change us. Remember who you are in Christ. Let faith define you, and may you become more and more each day the people that God is creating you to be.

Wednesday Lenten Services

Each Wednesday of Lent we will be livestreaming a service called "Compline." Compline is a beautiful and simple evening prayer. It includes prayer, scripture, and song and will be available live at 7:00

pm each Wednesday. There will be a link on our website www.trinityleb.org that will take you to this service. The video will also be posted to our website after it is concluded so that you can watch anytime you like.


If anyone signing up to sponsor flowers prefers fresh flowers, they can be placed as altar flowers or as one arrangement on the Chancel wall. Please be advised that fresh

flowers must be ordered, picked up and placed on the altar or Chancel wall by the party sponsoring the flowers for that Sunday. Sponsors must take flowers along with them after the service.

The church will no longer be handling any of these arrangements.

Below you will find all of the options for worship as well as what is required to participate. It is important that you keep this information handy.

In-person worship is resuming on February 28th at 9:00 am. We are well aware that many of you will not feel comfortable resuming in-person worship. We respect that perspective and further we do not recommend participation in this service if you are in a vulnerable category. We will continue to make worship available in a variety of platforms so that anyone who wishes to worship will be able to do so. Below you will find all of the options for worship as well as what is required to participate.

In Person Worship:

To make a reservation please visit www.trinityleb.org and follow the directions provided. You may also call Natasha Yiengst at 717-884-1592 to make a reservation. She will confirm all reservations within 48 hours of reaching out to her.

For the time-being seating is limited to 15 families/ households to ensure adequate space to social distance. We understand that some of you have close family and friends whom you have chosen to be regularly exposed to. We will leave it to your discretion whom you feel comfortable sitting with. Those of you who sign up as a single person would also be considered one unit. (please do not let signing up as a single person hinder you.) Only one person from your family/household needs to make a reservation. Please show up together to make the seating process easier for everyone.

If the worship limit has been reached when you contact us, you will be put on the list for the next upcoming week that works for you.

You may show up on Sunday morning even if you haven't made a reservation. Any left-over spots will be given out on a first-come, first-serve basis. However, understand that you may be turned away at the door. A radio version of the service will still be available to you – more on that under "Radio Worship Service".

All participants are required to wear a mask and adhere to social distancing. We will trust you to self-screen your-

self before entering the building. If you are running a fever or feeling ill in any way — we ask that you stay home. Also, if you have been exposed to anyone with Covid-19 or to someone who is awaiting test results for Covid-19 we ask that you not enter the church building. The parking lot door will be the only door open for entry and exit. As you enter you will be checked off the reservation list, you will pick up a communion packet which will be laid out on a nearby table, and you will be seated in a designated pew.

Please note that even as we try to keep the service as close to normal as possible, **there will be noticeable differences.** There will be limited congregational speaking and no singing. Yeah, it's a bummer.

After the service is over you will be dismissed by family group and asked to follow the signs leading you out of the building. We ask that any socializing happen outside with great attention paid to social distancing.

Radio Worship Service:

There will be a radio broadcast of the service available to those who are parked just outside of the church, either in the parking lot or on the street. Just tune your radio to 88.5 and you can sing your heart out. Communion and bulletins will also be available for anyone who would like to participate. Just stay in your car and someone will bring these items to you.

Online Worship Service:


Our online worship will continue to be available. As we begin in-person worship we will stream it through Youtube. Following the online service, drive-through communion will be available to anyone who would like it until 10:15 am. Pastor Gretchen will set up a distribution station on the Monument Park side of the church.





Though St. Patrick's Day has become a secular "holiday," March 17 commemorates the life of a Christian missionary. St. Patrick grew up in a Christian home in Britain but wasn't very devout until he experienced crisis. As a teen, he was captured and sold into slavery in Ireland, escaping after six years. "The Lord opened my unbelieving eyes" in Ireland, Patrick later said. God led him back there, and he converted tribe after tribe to Christianity.

In Confessio 61, St. Patrick writes, "I testify in truth and in great joy of heart before God and his holy angels that I never had any other reason for returning to that nation ... except the Gospel and God's promises."

Christian Symbol

Cross of Triumph

Also known as the Cross of Victory, this cross symbolizes Christ's final triumph and his reign throughout the earth. The Cross of Triumph is often depicted atop Jesus' scepter when he's shown in his kingly office.

Laud & honor on Palm Sunday



The Palm Sunday anthem "All Glory Laud and Honor" is one of Christendom's oldest hymns. St. Theodulf of Orleans, who helped reform the church under Charlemagne, wrote the lyrics in the year 820 while Palm Sunday imprisoned in France.

The lyrics recount Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, an event the medieval church reenacted every Palm Sunday. Clergy and townspeople processed from fields through the city gates, behind a Jesus figure riding a donkey. At the gates, children began singing the hymn in Latin Gloria, laus et honor — and onlookers soon chimed in.

City gates may be a thing of the past, as the website Hymnary.org notes, yet we still praise our blessed Redeemer "because we know just what kind of King he was and is — an everlasting King who reigns not just in Jerusalem but over the entire earth. What more could we do but praise him with glory, laud and honor."

All glory, laud and honor to you, Redeemer, King, to whom the lips of children made sweet hosannas ring.

You are the King of Israel and David's royal Son, now in the Lord's name coming, the King and Blessed One.
